SUPPORTING NARRATIVE

WHY OUR FRIENDS GROUP DESERVES RECOGNITION

The Trustees of the Tucker Free Library are proud to nominate the Friends of Tucker Free Library for the Sue Palmatier Award for Outstanding Support by a "Friends of the Library" Group.

The Friends of Tucker Free Library (FTFL) reconstituted as an organization after many years of dormancy in early 2019. Most of the individuals who attended the first organizational meeting came following open houses the trustees hosted to garner support for a library building project. These individuals came to the meeting knowing that they were going to be asked to do a lot of heavy lifting. Yet, they came and listened and signed on to re-form the FTFL that had been defunct for eight plus years.

Anyone who attended that meeting will recount with a chuckle, the impassioned plea our library director made: please consider serving on the board, "for just six months." It was an ambitious plan that the director had: reconstitute under old by-laws, review and recommend changes to said by-laws to the general members at an annual meeting, elect an executive board at that meeting, and apply for the coveted 501 c 3.

Not only did the Friends achieve all their goals, they also took it upon themselves to co-host gatherings with the Henniker Rotary and the Chamber of Commerce. They offered support to the library staff and trustees at multiple building project community listening sessions. At their Annual Meeting in October of 2019 everyone on the Executive Board agreed to continue serving for a one-year term. So much for the six-month commitment!

And then COVID hit.

WHO ARE THE FRIENDS

An initial meeting attracted some members of a past Friends group. These Friends hadn't been active for many years. These attendees were surprised at how much the re-formation of the group would entail. For example, the new group would grow from running bake, book and flower sales to dealing with documents for establishing a 501 c 3, updating by-laws and creating a Memorandum of Understanding with the trustees and being accountable for official government documents. They would also be challenged with growing their membership and supporting the director, staff and trustees with an upcoming building project.

It wasn't long before the group was all in. These are busy folks who support the library with time and talent. They use words and deeds to work alongside the trustees, the director and staff to further the vision and mission of the library in our community.

And all this continued during a world-wide pandemic. The group found ways to pivot and re-invent as the months passed. Coming out of the 2020 Pandemic our Friends board is strong with community connections.

A CORE GROUP OF LIBRARY SUPPORTERS FULFILLING THEIR MISSION

Our director is often heard saying that the Trustees of the Tucker Free Library support the skeletal and muscular foundation of the library but the Friends of Tucker Free Library support the heartbeat and soul of the library. Plain and simple, the Friends get to meet (and have fun doing so), make decision (which always make people happy), raise funds (through a simple ask), and spend money (making the library look great!) Our Friends group does this with kindness, humor, ingenuity and with generosity that promotes the library and satisfies their mission of:

"providing a public organization for the purpose of enhancing the Tucker Free Library's goal of providing the residents of Henniker with a center for information that stimulates the knowledge, culture and pure enjoyment of reading and learning."

Growing from a small group of library patrons, the Friends have planted the seed and continue to increase their membership through their highly visible advocacy of all things library.

FRIENDS OF TUCKER FREE LIBRARY

MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Especially during this difficult time of fear and uncertainty due to the COVID 19 pandemic, we appreciate the way that our Friends group has stepped up to help the Tucker Free Library continue to reach out to the Henniker community. Examples of their impact include:

- Motivational messaging initiative in the early days of the pandemic closures. During the early
 days of the COVID shutdown, the Friends decided to put out positive messages to our community.
 After many humorous emails, the Friends came up with a list of positive messages that they
 regularly updated and posted on a sign on the front steps of the library.
- A steady supply of cookies to library staff members who were struggling to keep their spirits up and their heads above the pandemic tsunami.
- Decking the halls for the first annual Holiday Decorating contest. In support of our new Town
 Administrator our director asked the Friends to fund and help decorate the library for the first
 ever "Henniker Holiday Decorating" contest. While we didn't win a prize, we definitely felt the
 holiday spirit during what was a bleak time... You can see the video of Friends having fun

- "Friends helping Friends" raffle. During the summer of 2020, when most of us were sheltering in
 place and our Henniker businesses were struggling, the Friends came up with the plan to help our
 patrons and local eateries with weekly gift certificate drawings. For twelve weeks, staff had the
 pleasure of making someone's day with a Saturday morning call proclaiming them winners!
- "Mud Season" raffle. To boost the spirits of our library patrons while they waited patiently for COVID restrictions to be lifted, the Friends had us change our thinking from winter to spring. They sponsored another raffle, this time to local garden supply centers. Again, their thought was to help patrons and local businesses struggling through the pandemic.

- "Take and Make" activity bags originating in the Children's Department were supported by the Friends.
- 8 virtual Sundays at the Library, hosted by the Friends, helped put Tucker Free Library back on the map in Henniker and well beyond.

As we emerge from pandemic restrictions, the Friends have been very quick to support activities and library visibility and re-introduction to the entire Henniker community. Their support includes:

- Pledged to fund the 2021 Summer Reading Reward program, including reimbursing local businesses who participate in the Token Reward program and funding the "Checkin and Checkout" raffle for adults. This raffle helps celebrate the return to normal library services and invites patrons to see what the Tucker Free Library is all about!
- The Friends are integral partners in the Library Ambassador initiative. When the director shared that Tucker Free would be receiving ARPA funds from the State Library, in the nature of true library ambassadors, the Friends asked how the money could be spent. The director floated two ideas, one for a marketing/public relations campaign and the other was a STEAM kit project. The Friends replied, "Let's do both!" At their meeting, they endorsed the marketing/public relations campaign as the ARPA project and agreed to use Friends' money to create STEAM kits for checkout! They attended a trustee meeting to show their support for both projects which were then endorsed by the board!
- They funded over \$800 in STEAM engagers, allowing for the creation of 30 circulating kits
 ranging in content from bongos to art supplies, from microscopes to architect tools, from yoga
 mats to coding mice! The complete list of STEAM engagers can be seen here.
- They stepped in as integral partners in the Outdoor Programming Space Exploration Team. When the director shared information about the Round 1 ARPA sub grants, there was also discussion about the money available in a competitive Round 2 for ARPA funds. The director said, "wouldn't it be great if we could create an outdoor programming space in the front of the building." The Friends endorsed this idea with two members volunteering to work with the director to lay the groundwork for this project.

DESERVING THE RECOGNITION

Throughout the pandemic the Friends buoyed our director, providing relief from the grind of managing a library during the crisis and allowed for moments to dream bigger, to think outside of the (ab)normal box, and to just have a virtual cuppa Joe early on a Saturday morning with a group of likeminded individuals, who love the Tucker Free Library as much as the director, the staff, and the trustees! The Friends all have a great sense of humor, and through the pandemic ordeal they helped the director and staff find the strength and fresh perspective to keep moving forward.

Mary Corsetti and Sylvia Lennox were members of the original Friends group. They were joined by newcomers Rob Reno, Ellen Chase-Lucard, and Naomi Praul. When our treasurer resigned early this year, we put out a call for a replacement and Gwen Airgood sent a letter expressing her interest. She joined the Friends in 2021 and has already made significant contributions to the group. There were members at large who have also contributed including Frances Tain (who is now a Board member), Bethany Newcomb, and Patricia Ball. Anne Crotti has served as Board Liaison since the beginning. These individuals have worked together to create something special in Henniker, growing their membership with each activity, newsletter release, and visible act. As a demonstrable testament to their significant impact, during the membership initiative of 2020, sixty-six percent of all new members contributed more than the suggested donation of \$20.00.

They may be a relatively "new" Friends group but they have made a huge impact. They continue in the tradition of the previous Friends group (circa 1976). Their name implies a certain level of comradery but the Friends truly give so much more.






