To the Town of Henniker, in the County of Merrimack and State of New Hampshire:

I, Leander A. Cogswell, of said Henniker, as a tribute to the loving memory of my deceased parents D. Warren Cogswell and Eliza L. Cogswell, and as an act of genuine regard for my native town, do hereby make and deliver to said Henniker this deed of gift, upon the terms and conditions as hereinafter set forth. It would be a pleasure to me if the town would erect a suitably inscribed tablet to perpetuate this memorial.

1. 1 hereby give to said Henniker the sum of fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000), as evidenced by my accompanying check fur that amount and payable to its order, but in trust, however, to be forever held, invested and reinvested by it through its legally constituted trustees and to be

known as the "D. Warren and Eliza L. Cogswell Memorial Fund."

2. 1 direct, and direction shall be a continuing and an express condition of this gift, that the net annual income arising from the foregoing trust fund shall each year be expended by said trustees, through such proper agents, trustees or officers of said town as may be established by it to carry out the objects herein designated, for the purposes and in the proportions following: Seventy per cent (70%) thereof for time support, maintenance and benefit of the Henniker High School and all other grades of public schools which are now or may hereafter be located in the Henniker High School building, so-called, in said Henniker, or winch may be similarly located in any other building, in said Henniker, devoted to like purposes; provided, however, that time school board of the school district in which said schools are or may be located shall apply during the current year such amount of the school money, received by them from any source, for the support and maintenance of the public schools of said Henniker herein particularly described and alluded to, as they would by law be required to expend if tile trust fund hereby created

were not in existence; ten per cent (10%) thereof for the support, maintenance and benefit of The Tucker Free Library, located in said town; ten per cent (10%) thereof for the care, repair and benefit of the Henniker Cemetery Association and the lots therein, located in said town; and ten per cent. (10%) thereof for shade or ornamental trees to be placed along highways or other public places, and for park or commons, 'all to be located in said town and within a radius of one—half (1/2) mile from what is now known as Proctor Square.

- 3, I further direct, and this direction shall also be a continuing and express condition of this gift, that the expenditure by said trustees of the net annual income arising from said trust fund as hereinbefore set forth shall not at any time be controlled, regulated, supervised, changed or modified by the State of New Hampshire, or by the State Board of Education, or by any other local State Board or by any other public officer or agent, or other representative of said State or said boards.
- 4. From time to time I direct said trustees having the custody of said trust fund, to advance to said town so much of the principal thereof as may be needed by it to pay the principal of said Town of Henniker Water Bonds, heretofore issued by and now outstanding against it, to the

I, Leander A. Cogswell, of said Henniker, as a tribute to the loving memory of my deceased parents D. Warren Cogswell and Eliza L. Cogswell, and as an act of genuine regard for my native town, do hereby make and deliver to said Henniker this deed of gift, upon the terms and conditions as hereinafter set forth. It would be a pleasure to me if the town would erect a suitably inscribed tablet to perpetuate this memorial.

1. 1 hereby give to said Henniker the sum of fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000), as evidenced by my accompanying check fur that amount and payable to its order, but in trust, however, to be forever held, invested and reinvested by it through its legally constituted trustees and to be

known as the "D. Warren and Eliza L. Cogswell Memorial Fund."

2. 1 direct, and direction shall be a continuing and an express condition of this gift, that the net annual income arising from the foregoing trust fund shall each year be expended by said trustees, through such proper agents, trustees or officers of said town as may be established by it to carry out the objects herein designated, for the purposes and in the proportions following: Seventy per cent (70%) thereof for time support, maintenance and benefit of the Henniker High School and all other grades of public schools which are now or may hereafter be located in the Henniker High School building, so-called, in said Henniker, or winch may be similarly located in any other building, in said Henniker, devoted to like purposes; provided, however, that time school board of the school district in which said schools are or may be located shall apply during the current year such amount of the school money, received by them from any source, for the support and maintenance of the public schools of said Henniker herein particularly described and alluded to, as they would by law be required to expend if tile trust fund hereby created

## TUCKER FREE LIBRARY ANNUAL REPORT 1988

1988 was a year of accomplishment at the Tucker Free Library in the areas of conventional library services and also in the renovation of the actual library building. This was the second year of the long range library capital improvement plan. With the \$10,000 which the town appropriated a plaster ceiling was repaired, old windows in the downstairs children's room were completely replaced with new, energy efficient ones, and the painting of the library interior was completed. This interior decorating included repairing and replacing the original stenciling, much of which is gold leaf. Our renovations did not end there. We received more interest from the trust funds than anticipated, and we decided to use those to continue improving the building. This included electrical work, new non-slip rubber stair covering, refinishing the reference room floor and extensive work to create magazine storage space.

Emphasis was not only put on the library building last year but also on improving and expanding services to our patrons. The school children, grades kindergarten through sixth, continue to visit us on a regular basis. We believe that their familiarity with the town library is something from which they benefit for the rest of their lives for it encourages a habit of reading. Membership in the children's summer programs again increased. 103 were enrolled in the story hours and the 91 members of the reading programs read a total of 1,078 books in six weeks.

We are always searching for ways to improve and expand services to our adult patrons and one success this year was the addition of audio cassettes (talking books) to our collection. This coming year will see the introduction of some excellent video cassettes. I must emphasize that these videos were not purchased from our budget but are the result of winning an outright grant from the MacArthur Foundation. The monetary value of the award totals \$3,000, given to us in the form of videos of selected PBS series.

The Friends of the Library have been very active and supportive throughout the year. Their annual book, bake and plant sale was the most successful ever. They funded the children's summer programs and also purchased a paperback rack, a set of science encyclopedia and \$200 worth of audio cassettes for the library.

The library's memorial trust funds received very generous donations this past year. The Marjorie B. Bennett fund enables the purchase of books in the fields of history and health. The Sanborn Conner Brown Memorial allows us to continue improving and expanding the reference section. The proceeds from the Scott J. Berry Memorial purchase volumes in the areas of art, woodwork, and motor repair. The long established trust funds, including the town trust funds, Willis Cogswell Trust, Francis L. Childs Trust, and the James W. Doon Memorial continue to be of great benefit to the library.

As in past years the library received several "in memoriam" books, which are always welcome additions to our collection.

The library would like to publicly acknowledge with gratitude all the gifts, help and support which we constantly receive from the community.

## COMMUNITY ACTION PROGRAM

For the past twelve years, the Kearsarge Valley Community Action Prograhas been the focal point of social service delivery in this area, providing he when needed to the income-eligible and elderly, as well as to the communat large.

Community Action Program Belknap-Merrimack Counties, Inc., general funds through the mobilization of available federal, state and local monic Support for the local Area Center comes from a combination of federal a propriations and local tax dollars, so that the Kearsarge C.A.P. can provide Henniker with a variety of services from programs for local needs to outreac referral, and direct assistance.

The town's appropriation of the requested \$2,864 in 1988 resulted in sevices to Henniker residents whose total value was actually \$53,824. The include congregate meals, meals-on-wheels, fuel assistance, USDA surple foods, specific food supplements and medical and nutritional assistance women, infants and children under the WIC program, and other program most of which are limited to income-eligible applicants. For example, 3 foods. A detailed summary of the past year's services is on file in the office of the Board of Selectmen.

It should be noted that since 1982 there has been a 28% reduction of federand state support for fuel assistance and a 45% reduction in operating fund due to reductions in Congressional appropriations for the fuel assistance program and the greater percentage taken by the state to support their acministrative office.
